

KENYON COLLEGE COLLEGIATE REQUIREMENT SELF-AUDIT

While faculty members and administrators stand ready to counsel students about degree requirements, the final responsibility for meeting those requirements rests with the individual student. In addition, all information in this self-audit can be found in the Kenyon College Course Catalog online.

REQUIREMENTS FOR BA DEGREE:

1. The student must successfully complete a major course of study, including the Senior Exercise.
2. 0.50 unit of credit in a course or courses designated as QR (quantitative reasoning).
3. The student must complete at least one (1) unit, within at least one department, in each of the four divisions. (Humanities, Fine Arts, Social Science, Natural Science).
4. Eight semesters of full-time undergraduate enrollment are required. A minimum of four of these semesters, including the senior year, must be completed at Kenyon College, on the Gambier campus.
5. Proficiency in a second language or equivalent to one full year of college study.
6. 9.0 units outside your major discipline or 7.0 units outside multi-discipline department.

RESTRICTIONS OR LIMITATION ON CREDIT:

A maximum of 3.00 units of Pass/D/Fail or credit/no credit may be taken (this does not include PHSD classes that are automatically graded on a pass/fail basis). If you have declared your major, you CANNOT take a course in the department of your major on a Pass/D/Fail basis.

A maximum of .50 units of PHSD courses are allowed for application toward your degree.

AP and IB credits do not count towards diversification. They do however, count towards your 16 units for graduation, credit outside your major, and can also be used to fulfill your language requirement (scores of 3, 4, or 5 on AP and 6 or 7 on High Level IB). <http://www.kenyon.edu/directories/offices-services/registrar/resources-for-students/ap-and-ib-programs/>. A maximum of 3.0 units of AP/IB credit are allowed for application toward your degree. AP/IB credit may not be substituted for a semester of residency at the College.

A maximum of 3.0 units of summer school are allowed for application toward our degree. Credit earned in summer school may not be counted as a substitution for a semester of residency at the College.

Please note: Kenyon will not accept transfer credit or test scores for which transfer credit will be granted more than one year after the completion of the coursework/testing (except in the case of a student admitted to Kenyon as a transfer student) or AP scores which must be received by December of your sophomore year at Kenyon.
